 - <u>Handwashing</u>: We touch our faces, a lot. Researchers videotaped office workers for 3 hours, finding an average of 16 touches of eyes, nostrils or lips per hour. Another study found that people rub their eyes or pick their nose at least once every 3 hours.

 - <u>Cloth Masks</u>: *When wear?* In community settings, especially in situations where you might be near people (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies).

- V. Evidence-Based Practice Update [Mark, Miquela]
 - a. MMWR Report (May 12, 2020): High SARS-CoV-2 Attack Rate Following Exposure at a Choir Practice Skagit County, Washington, March 2020
 - "This outbreak of COVID-19 with a high secondary attack rate indicates that SARS-CoV-2 might be highly transmissible in certain settings, including group singing events. This underscores the importance of physical distancing, including maintaining at least 6 feet between persons, avoiding group gatherings and crowded places, and wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain during this pandemic. The choir mitigated further spread by quickly communicating to its members and notifying SCPH of a cluster of cases on March 18."

- b. MMWR Report (May 15, 2020): COVID-19 in Correctional and Detention Facilities United States, February–April 2020
- "Correctional and detention facilities face challenges in controlling the spread of infectious diseases because of crowded, shared environments and potential introductions by staff members and new intakes.
- "Among 37 jurisdictions reporting, 32 (86%) reported at least one confirmed COVID-19 case among incarcerated or detained persons or staff
- members, across 420 correctional and detention facilities. "[4,893 cases, 88 deaths]
- Implications? Prompt identification of persons with COVID-19 and consistent application of prevention measures within correctional and detention facilities are critical to protecting incarcerated or detained persons, staff members, and the communities to which they return.
